



DELTA SIGMA THETA SORORITY, INC. National Profile

Founded on January 13, 1913, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated was established by twenty-two collegiate women at Howard University. These students wanted to use their collective strength to promote academic excellence and to provide assistance to persons in need. The first public act performed by the Delta Founders involved their participation in the Women's Suffrage March in March 1913 in Washington, D.C.

Delta Sigma Theta was incorporated in 1930, and the women of this organization have never strayed from the mission their founders created, which is now their legacy. Delta Sigma Theta Sorority is a private, non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide services and programs to promote human welfare. The Grand Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. has a membership of over 200,000 predominately African-American, college-educated women. The Sorority currently has 900-plus chapters located in the United States; Tokyo and Okinawa, Japan; Germany; Bermuda; the Bahamas; Seoul, Korea; St. Thomas and St. Croix of the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The major programs of the Sorority are based upon the organization's Five-Point Thrust:

- * Economic Development
- * Educational Development
- * International Awareness and Involvement
- * Physical and Mental Health
- * Political Awareness and Involvement

In March 2003, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. became a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) at the United Nations. In a presentation by Hanifa Mezoui, Chief NGO Section, Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the UN (ECOSOC), Past National President Gwendolyn Boyd (who served as National President during this time) accepted the credentials on behalf of the sorority, before 150 members of the organization from across the country. Delta Sigma Theta was welcomed to the United Nations by Assistant Secretary General for External Affairs, Gillian Sorensen, who asked the sorority in her keynote address to "use your NGO status to monitor the status of women and children in the world and bind together with other NGOs to insure that the UN honors its commitments." Delta Sigma Theta was granted Special Consultative Status as an NGO to the Economic and Social Council of the UN as a result of its volunteer services and humanitarian efforts performed to address issues throughout the world.

In 2013 Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. celebrated a century of Sisterhood and Service, commemorating the centennial anniversary of the organization's founding.

CHAPTER HISTORY

DALLAS ALUMNAE CHAPTER

For 100 years, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Dallas Alumnae Chapter has stood as a pillar of empowerment, advocacy, and service in Dallas County. Chartered in 1924 by Founder Frederica Chase Dodd, this dynamic chapter has blazed a trail of excellence, transforming lives and communities through its relentless dedication to sisterhood, scholarship, service, and social action.

Pioneering Beginnings

The chapter's origins are a testament to the vision and determination of its charter members: Frederica Chase Dodd (President), Ruth Mason, Jesse Pollard, Ruby Pollard, and Nettie Wycliff. As the **first chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority**, **Inc. chartered in the state of Texas**, this groundbreaking achievement underscored the chapter's vital role in advancing opportunities for African American women and communities in the region. With a passion for uplifting their community, they chartered the Eta Beta Chapter, which later evolved into the Dallas Alumnae Chapter in 1960. Despite obstacles, including the loss of the original charter in a fire, the chapter's resilience and commitment to progress never wavered.

From its earliest days, the chapter championed partnerships with organizations like the Red Cross, Community Chest, and YWCA to address systemic inequities and advance the rights and welfare of African Americans in Dallas. This spirit of collaboration was rooted in a bold legacy of advocacy, beginning with its participation in the Women's Suffrage March—the first social action activity by Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.

Signature Programs that Transform Communities.

Over the decades, the Dallas Alumnae Chapter has developed a legacy of impactful programs that reflect its deep commitment to advocacy and social change. These initiatives have not only addressed critical needs but have also fostered meaningful partnerships and inspired collective action:

- Delta Joy Woodfork Beauty Salon brings dignity and joy to residents of the Modern Living Rehabilitation Center, with youth from Delta GEMS lending their voices and presence to enrich intergenerational connections.
- Community Market Festival champions economic empowerment by connecting local vendors with the broader community, showcasing the chapter's dedication to fostering prosperity.

Although the property was sold in 2021, the chapter's legacy of service continues, marked by reinvestments in community projects, including a \$10,000 donation to the Juanita Craft Museum.

As part of its centennial commemoration, the Dallas Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. raised nearly \$300,000—an extraordinary testament to its enduring commitment to empowering communities and creating lasting change. This monumental achievement reflects the chapter's unwavering dedication to service and its ability to inspire collective generosity. Dr. Stimpson serves her community to strengthen STEM awareness and knowledge by educating students about the wonders and possibilities of science. Her passion for science began in a household with pharmacists, her parents. Recognizing the need for more robust science education, Dr. Stimpson advocates for the future and promise of STEM education by advancing science education through her educational philosophy and teaching practices.

As a leader in science education, Jennifer spent a year working for Congress, as an Albert Einstein Distinguished Educator, crafting STEM Education legislation for Congress. Her policy experience helped launch the HBCU Podcast and work with the Education Policy Fellow Program, representing the state of Texas. Her career began as a forensic chemist, working at the Dallas County Morgue and the Drug Enforcement Administration. Jennifer has worked at the Hockaday School, Dallas ISD's Yvonne Ewell Townview Magnet, and led programs with the T.D. Jakes Foundation.

Dr. Stimpson, who is currently a member of Dallas Alumnae, was initiated into the Beta Gamma Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta at Dillard University. She served on the sorority's National Program, Planning and Development Committee. Jennifer was the National Torch Chair for the Sorority's Centennial celebration. During college, she was elected Programs Vice President, leading her chapter to receive numerous awards for community service on campus and within the city of New Orleans. Jennifer served as the second vice president of the North Dallas Suburban Alumnae Chapter, was part of the Southwest Region Project SEE (Science in Everyday Experiences) Committee, and served as program chair for the Dallas PanHellenic Council.

Jennifer's note-worthy recognition includes the 2022 Woman of Distinction for the Girl Scouts, a City of Dallas proclamation lauding her for creating a sustainable biofuel source for the school district's transportation system, and Dallas College naming her an Exemplary Teaching Award winner and role model for future STEM teachers. Oprah Magazine honored Dr. Stimpson, as well as the State of Texas, the Michael Jordan Foundation, and the Drug Enforcement Administration, for her work in science education. Jennifer received the inaugural Hidden Figures in STEM Dallas Award from the National Society of Black Engineers. Dr. Stimpson was a finalist for the People's Choice Award by Ebony Magazine, and the Texas Women's Foundation honored Jennifer with their prestigious Maura Women Helping Women Award. But one of her most prominent recognitions was the life-size statue of her likeness at the Smithsonian Museum in Washington, DC. honoring her STEM education career. In the fall of 2024, Jennifer will be one of the featured STEM professionals in McGraw Hill Science Textbooks for the State of Texas.

With a global vision of creating change, Jennifer recognizes the need for more vital science literacy and serves her community to strengthen STEM awareness and knowledge. To that end, she is the founder of the National Association of Black Science Teachers. She holds active membership with The Links Incorporated, Leadership Women, National Girls Collaborative, and The Dallas Summit. She serves on the board of directors at Montessori Children's House, the ChildCare Group, and the STEM advisory board for Northeast Texas' Girl Scouts.
